## Northwest Arctic Subsistence Regional Advisory Council Meeting rescheduled to be held virtually November 8, 2024

The Northwest Arctic Subsistence Regional Advisory Council meeting has been rescheduled to Friday, November 8, 2024. The meeting was originally scheduled to take place in Kotzebue on October 28-29, 2024, but due to impacts to the community from the recent winter storm and ongoing clean-up efforts the meeting will now be held virtually on the new date.

The Council will develop topics for their FY-2024 Annual Report to the Federal Subsistence Board, review Priority Information Needs for the Fisheries Resources Monitoring Program, and discuss other issues related to subsistence in the Northwest Arctic Region. The public is welcome to attend and opportunities for public comment will be provided.
