Summary

The Department of the Interior is taking action to strengthen our ability to meet our mission in the face of a changing climate. In 2023, the Department of the Interior released six climate policies in the form of Department Manual chapters covering <u>climate change</u>, <u>applying climate change science</u>, <u>adaptive</u> <u>management</u>, <u>and landscape-level management</u>, as well as <u>nature-based solutions</u> and <u>Indigenous</u> <u>Knowledge</u>. These policies direct bureaus and offices to factor the climate crisis into our operations and reflect the Department's commitment to leveraging science, Indigenous Knowledge and landscape-scale management as foundational components of Departmental decision-making. This special seminar will provide an overview of the six recently released climate Departmental Manual chapters and offer an opportunity to hear from key members of the Coordination Program for Resilience and Environment (CPRE) and its constituent working groups—a team of experts now working across the Department to develop tools, networks, guidance, and training materials to support the implementation of these policies.
