





### WAH Abundance

  - Long-term average (70%)






### Recruitment

  - Long term average = 17


Number of short yearlings: 100 adults

#### **WAH Short Yearling Survey Results**




## Fall Composition

  - Long term average = 80%





# Limiting Cow Harvest

- IM Objective of at least 200,000
  - Harvest Objective 12,000-20,000
- WAH and TCH combined ANS of 8,000-12,000
- Harvestable surplus is approximately 7300; with no more than 1% or fewer of the available cows (~750)



### Proposals to BOG & FSB

#### **BOG Proposal #2**

 Reduce the resident bag limit to 4 caribou annually, of which only 1 may be a cow in Units 21D remainder, 22, 23, 24B remainder, 24C, 24D and 26A

#### **BOG Proposal #3**

Close nonresident caribou hunting in Units 21D remainder, 22, 23, 24B remainder, 24C, 24D, and 26A

#### FSB Proposal WP 24-28

 Reduce the harvest limit of caribou across the range of the Western Arctic Caribou Herd to 4 caribou per year per permit, only one of which may be a cow

#### FSB Proposal WP 24-30/31

Close to non-federally qualified users in Unit 23 from Aug 1 – Oct 31

 Changed from general harvest ticket to Drawing tag with up to 300 permits issued (1 bull)


- (N) South bank of Coleville River

# Increased bear harvest opportunity

- Year-round
   resident brown
   bear harvest in

- Nonresident limit increased to 2 bears a year



### Federal Subsistence Board Actions


Individual caribou harvest limit was reduced across the range of the Western Arctic Caribou Herd

GMU's 21D remainder, 22, 23, 24B remainder, 24C, 24D, and the southwestern portion of Unit 26A to 15 caribou/year, only one of which may be a cow

Federal public lands in Unit 23 closed to caribou hunting by non-federally qualified users

Aug.1-Oct. 31 unless the Western Arctic Herd exceeds 200,000 caribou
