

Thank you for sharing your thoughts with Superintendent Mark Butler, Seth Shteir of National Parks Conservation Association, and myself.

For your reference my notes on the transfer of Saddle to Joshua Tree National Park:

- 1. Compliment the socio/economics of the community
 - a. Rural lifestyle
 - b. Quality of life: recreation, no solar or wind

- c. Ecological values: wildlife links, 30,000 acre Pandora wind farm, 63,000 acre wind farm at east end of Park
- d. Problems with wind: 500'+ tall, flashing lights, bird mortality, huge base, trenching and road building, loss of access
- e. Recreation is a renewable resource, will not play out
