2021 Natural Resources Projects





- Full fisheries crew worked this summer at RM 22 and Telequana counting stations
- 560k sockeye count at Newhalen River and 120k at Telequana
- Soundscape monitoring baseline
- Invasive plants at Sixmile Lake
- Beaver impact on water quality work continues

2021 Education and Outreach Plans





- "Day Camp in a Box": Provided 100 elementary age kids in Nondalton, Newhalen, and Port Alsworth with hands on, interactive activities to keep kids busy and having fun outdoors and through art.
- Worked hard to reach communities in Lake and Penn District with Port Heiden, Port Graham, Pilot Point, Chignik Lagoon as well as Tyonek.
- Did have Qua/Tazn Kijik culture camp this summer with youth and elders from around the lakes region.
- Scheduling distance learning for next year.
- Will be filming park film next year. Will film in all four seasons and highlight the indigenous history and traditional knowledge.
