Secretary,

Demonstrations in Washington, D.C. sparked by the in-custody death of George Floyd began the evening of 29 May 2020 and are continuing.

Since that first small demonstrations, protests within the District of Columbia have exponentially grown. These demonstrations have changed not only in size, but also in the violent behavior exhibited by a some of participants. Violent acts have included the throwing of bricks and other projectiles at law enforcement officers, various degrees of property damage crimes and arson. These demonstrations have become less organized, less predictable and have begun to impact multiple areas of Washington, DC simultaneously.

Within the wider protest community, there is a vocal and active element encouraging the destruction of statues that represent some clear ideology (Albert Pike, confederate slave holder) vs. some that are less clear (Ulysses S. Grant). Last night, another round of violent protesters damaged the President Andrew Jackson statue in Lafayette Park. Other statues in the park and elsewhere within the District of Columbia have been vandalized during the current unrest and will continue to be targets in the near future as the current climate of destruction continues to gain steam and some wider support from segments of our society.

The United States Park Police needs assistance to protect the iconic DC National Monuments and the less known historic parks and monuments throughout the District of Columbia. In the current threat environment, the USPP does not have the personnel to adequately staff the National Parks to protect all of the historic structures from vandalism or destruction. We are requesting the support of the DC National Guard to assist us with this effort. Please find attached a draft letter for your consideration to send to Secretary Esper requesting National Guard support.

Dear Secretary Esper:

The civil unrest and violent protests that began on May 29, 2020 have continued in the District of Columbia and the United States Park Police (USPP) continues to carry out daily plans for the security of the White House Complex and National Park Service resources in and around the National Mall. While there continues to be some peaceful protests, violent unrest has become more sporadic and intense. This subset of protestors has instigated acts of vandalism to numerous historical statues and monuments and have responded with violence when confronted by law enforcement. Due to the current threat environment of known planned demonstrations, National celebrations, spontaneous acts of vandalism and the numerous historic sites and statue that could be targets for destruction, we are requesting further assistance of the District of Columbia National Guard (DCNG) in accordance with established policies and authorities. As you are aware, National Guard units are currently activated to assist with civil unrest and infrastructure protection missions in numerous areas of the United States.

A significant number of law enforcement personnel will be needed to effectively secure and manage protests in the coming days. The USPP is requesting assistance from the DCNG to serve in a security role, which would serve as a uniformed deterrence and crowd management mission to assist in maintaining closures and restricted areas.

The USPP has limited flexibility to expand its force to meet these large-scale requirements and, therefore, it is critical that we leverage the assistance of our partnering agencies to fulfill our mission.

The USPP respectfully requests, in accordance with 10 U.S.C. § 377(c) and 32 U.S.C. §502(f)(2), the following support be provided on a non-reimbursable basis:

Effective 1600 hours on June 23, 2020, through 2400 hours on July 5, 2020, we request the continued support of up to (b) (5) DCNG personnel to provide the following functions relative to the USPP Security Plan:

1. To provide a (b) (5), (b) (7)(E)

2. Support of the overall incident action plan established by the USPP.

Please note the USPP already have an approved request for assistance for July 4, 2020, for (b) (5), DCNG.

DCNG personnel will be serving in a civil disturbance and security role, therefore we require that all DCNG personnel providing support to the USPP for this mission be designated as "Special Policemen," pursuant to D.C. Code Ann. § 5-205 (2001) and 54 U.S.C. § 102701. As such, DCNG personnel will have law enforcement authority to act on Federal park land. This designation will provide them with civil and criminal liability protection during the mission.

No DCNG personnel will be armed with firearms for this mission, but will have shields, riot batons, and appropriate chemical munitions in accordance with DCNG policy. Absent exigent circumstances, no DCNG personnel will conduct searches, seizures, or arrests. It is requested that DCNG personnel be equipped with appropriate crowd control equipment to assist with this mission. At no time will DCNG personnel or assets be engaged in domestic surveillance of U.S. persons during this mission. At all times, the DCNG military chain-of- command will remain intact for purposes of administrative and operational control.

DESTRUCTION OF NPS PROPERTY DURING DEMONSTRATION

In the wake of Juneteenth rallies that took place yesterday, approximately 150-200 people pulled down and burned a statue of Albert Pike in D.C. late last night. The statue was located in Judiciary Square in NW D.C. and was owned and managed by NPS. USPP responded to the scene and documented the incident. Protesters have cleared the area. Most USPP units returned back to normal patrol operations by 3:00 a.m. EDT, but one unit remains on scene until NPS personnel arrive this morning. There were no reports of injuries. NPS will respond to the site this morning. Demonstrations are expected to continue throughout the weekend, with continued potential for vandalism or destruction of monuments celebrating Confederate figures or other public figures associated with racism.

- **Wildland Fire Update** – The National Preparedness Level (PL) is currently 3, [with increasing fire activity throughout the Southwest and AK areas](#). The Southwest Area remains at PL 4. To date, [nearly 284,000 acres have burned throughout the Southwest](#), with [46,797 acres](#) burned on DOI managed lands. The fire activity in the Southwest Area continues to be largely on U.S. Forest Service and State lands. AK remains at PL 3. To date, [approximately 163,000 acres](#) have burned throughout the State, with nearly 36,000 acres burned on DOI-managed lands. Nationally, there are [21 fires](#) across Federal, State, County, and private lands being managed under a full containment strategy. There are [five](#) large DOI fires being managed under a full containment strategy, with two in AZ (Blue River Fire / 30,408 acres / 90% contained and Dry Lake Fire / 4,369 acres / 90% contained), one in CO (East Canyon Fire / [2,900 acres / 21% contained](#)), [one in SD](#) (Wilson Road Fire / 1,577 acres / [95% contained](#)) and [one in AK](#) (Ingakslugwat Hills Fire / [52,250 acres / 0% contained](#)). There continue to be multiple large fires in AK on DOI, Forest Service, and State lands being managed with a strategy other than full suppression.
- **First Amendment Demonstrations, Washington D.C.** – Multiple First Amendment demonstrations are scheduled this weekend throughout Washington D.C. As a result of the planned demonstration activity, numerous parking restrictions and street closures will be implemented until Sunday, June 21 at 11:59 p.m. EDT. The street closures are expected to be intermittent, and if implemented, personnel will be allowed to enter the restricted area if they are on essential business or traveling to or from their residence. The parking restrictions will be in place through the weekend. The District of Columbia advises that all street closures are subject to change, based on the existing conditions, and those traveling to the District this weekend should expect to experience delays. 

Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA)

A recently discovered error occurred in transmitting case information from the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) and Bureau of Indian Education (BIE). These increases do not represent new cases, rather they correct an error in reporting from the last several months.

- There are a total of five (5) COVID-19 related employee deaths being reported. The IOC previously reported a total of two (2) deaths; BIE is reporting an additional three (3) employee deaths, though none of these cases are "new". Information is still being compiled as to the nature and dates of those deaths (COVID-19 related or other).
- BIA reported one (1) new confirmed COVID-19 case in their latest report from June 18, which is accurate, bringing their total positive confirmed cases to 30.
- BIE is now reporting an additional 26 confirmed positive employee cases, bringing their total to 27, but these are not new cases. These cases were not reported previously and BIE is now engaging in "catch-up" reporting.





DOI Employee Guidance on the Wear of Cloth Face Coverings

The health and safety of our employees is our top priority. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has released [updated guidance](#) recommending that all people wear cloth face coverings over their nose and mouth in public settings. These simple coverings serve as a control measure intended to prevent community transmission of COVID-19. Employees reporting to worksites are encouraged to wear cloth face coverings when social distancing cannot be maintained. Employees and their family members are also encouraged to follow these recommendations when out in the community. Cloth face coverings are approved for wear while in uniform for employees that must report to worksites during the COVID-19 pandemic. Please note that cloth face coverings need to be temporarily removed for security purposes, such as when entering and exiting a building. Cloth face coverings are not a replacement for respirators for jobs with a high risk of exposure to COVID-19.


The White Mountain Apache Tribe in AZ reports over 1,300 cases in a population of 12,000 (10.8%); increasing testing capacity remains top priority and the Tribe is working with the Indian Health Service and Bureau of Indian Affairs to identify and refine strategies.

The Logistics, Supply Chain, and Next Gen SNS Working Group met with the CDC and the Biomedical Advanced Research and Development Authority (BARDA) to define vaccination kitting requirements to support Operation Warp Speed.

Recognizing the PPE supply chain is stabilizing across the nation, the Unified Coordination Group approved [phasing out of Project Airbridge](#) and scaling back flights through mid-June, with the final flight landing in the U.S. on or about June 30. This shipment method, the focus of the acceleration effort of FEMA's supply chain task force, was a temporary solution to expedite the transportation of commercially distributed PPE from international manufacturers to the U.S. Project Airbridge will remain an option to expedite deliveries of medical items should the U.S. have a future emergent need for critical PPE due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)

National/State/Local

The Office of Personnel Management has updated the nationwide [operating status](#) for federal agencies advising that the federal government has begun a phased transition to normal operations. Decisions on opening are based on the state or locality of the duty station, as well as other factors.

National Capital Region (NCR)

As of June 21, there are 76,182 confirmed or presumed positive cases of COVID-19, and 2,892 reported deaths in the NCR.

Mayor Muriel Bowser announced that Phase 2 will begin on June 22.

The Department of Defense (DoD) released a memorandum providing guidance on contractor personnel returning to DoD onsite locations identified in Washington Headquarters Services (WHS) contracts (Pentagon Reservation Offices), during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. The memorandum outlines: general social distancing and other safety requirements, situations when a contracted employee should remain at home and/or in quarantine and provides guidance on addressing issues related to contracted personnel returning to onsite locations.

Virginia

Phase 3 of the "Forward Virginia" plan has been presented to continue easing public health restrictions while mitigating the spread of COVID-19. The Commonwealth does not yet have a targeted date for entering Phase 3. In Phase 3, the Commonwealth will maintain a "Safer- at- Home" strategy with continued recommendations for social distancing, teleworking, and the requirement that individuals wear face coverings in indoor public settings.

Maryland

Maryland Department of Health officials are urging county leaders to step up local COVID-19 testing efforts and meet the goal of testing 10% of their populations. The state will soon begin publishing testing volume data by jurisdiction on coronavirus.maryland.gov so that Marylanders can track local progress. As of June 18, Maryland has tested 7.4% of the state's population.









DESTRUCTION OF NPS PROPERTY DURING DEMONSTRATION

In the wake of Juneteenth rallies that took place yesterday, approximately 150-200 people pulled down and burned a statue of Albert Pike in D.C. late last night. The statue was located in Judiciary Square in NW D.C. and was owned and managed by NPS. USPP responded to the scene and documented the incident. Protesters have cleared the area. Most USPP units returned back to normal patrol operations by 3:00 a.m. EDT, but one unit remains on scene until NPS personnel arrive this morning. There were no reports of injuries. NPS will respond to the site this morning. Demonstrations are expected to continue throughout the weekend, with continued potential for vandalism or destruction of monuments celebrating Confederate figures or other public figures associated with racism.

To date, over 275,000 acres have burned throughout the Southwest and AK areas, with 47,765 acres burned on DOI managed lands. The fire activity in the Southwest Area continues to be largely on U.S. Forest Service and State lands. Alaska remains at PL 3. To date, over 166,000 acres have burned throughout the State, with nearly 36,000 acres burned on DOI-managed lands. Nationally, there are 21 fires across Federal, State, County, and private lands being managed under a full containment strategy. There are four large DOI fires being managed under a full containment strategy, with two in AZ (Blue River Fire / 30,408 acres / 90% contained and Dry Lake Fire / 4,369 acres / 90% contained), one in CO (East Canyon Fire / 2,860 acres / 17% contained), and one in SD (Wilson Road Fire / 1,577 acres / 50% contained). There are multiple large fires in AK on DOI, Forest Service, and State lands being managed with a strategy other than full suppression.

National Park Service (NPS) / U.S. Park Police (USPP)

The Albert Pike Statue was owned and managed by the National Park Service. NPS will respond to the site in the morning.

USPP reported that approximately 150-200 people removed the statue from its foundation and lit it on fire. USPP responded and documented the incident. Protesters have cleared the area at this time. Most USPP personnel have left the site and resumed normal patrol operations, however, one USPP unit will remain on site until NPS arrives in the morning. There have been no reports of injuries.







Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA)

A recently discovered error occurred in transmitting case information from the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) and Bureau of Indian Education (BIE). These increases do not represent new cases, rather they correct an error in reporting from the last several months.

- There are a total of five (5) COVID-19 related employee deaths being reported. The IOC previously reported a total of two (2) deaths; BIE is reporting an additional three (3) employee deaths, though none of these cases are "new". Information is still being compiled as to the nature and dates of those deaths (COVID-19 related or other).
- BIA reported one (1) new confirmed COVID-19 case in their latest report from June 18, which is accurate, bringing their total positive confirmed cases to 30.
- BIE is now reporting an additional 26 confirmed positive employee cases, bringing their total to 27, but these are not new cases. These cases were not reported previously and BIE is now engaging in "catch-up" reporting.





DOI Employee Guidance on the Wear of Cloth Face Coverings

The health and safety of our employees is our top priority. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has released [updated guidance](#) recommending that all people wear cloth face coverings over their nose and mouth in public settings. These simple coverings serve as a control measure intended to prevent community transmission of COVID-19. Employees reporting to worksites are encouraged to wear cloth face coverings when social distancing cannot be maintained. Employees and their family members are also encouraged to follow these recommendations when out in the community. Cloth face coverings are approved for wear while in uniform for employees that must report to worksites during the COVID-19 pandemic. Please note that cloth face coverings need to be temporarily removed for security purposes, such as when entering and exiting a building. Cloth face coverings are not a replacement for respirators for jobs with a high risk of exposure to COVID-19.


The White Mountain Apache Tribe in AZ reports over 1,300 cases in a population of 12,000 (10.8%); increasing testing capacity remains top priority and the Tribe is working with the Indian Health Service and Bureau of Indian Affairs to identify and refine strategies.

The Logistics, Supply Chain, and Next Gen SNS Working Group met with the CDC and the Biomedical Advanced Research and Development Authority (BARDA) to define vaccination kitting requirements to support Operation Warp Speed.

Recognizing the PPE supply chain is stabilizing across the nation, the Unified Coordination Group approved [phasing out of Project Airbridge](#) and scaling back flights through mid-June, with the final flight landing in the U.S. on or about June 30. This shipment method, the focus of the acceleration effort of FEMA's supply chain task force, was a temporary solution to expedite the transportation of commercially distributed PPE from international manufacturers to the U.S. Project Airbridge will remain an option to expedite deliveries of medical items should the U.S. have a future emergent need for critical PPE due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

National Capital Region (NCR)

As of June 19, there are 75,720 confirmed or presumed positive cases of COVID-19, and 2,880 reported deaths in the NCR.

Mayor Muriel Bowser announced that Phase 2 will begin on June 22.

The Department of Defense (DoD) released a memorandum providing guidance on contractor personnel returning to DoD onsite locations identified in Washington Headquarters Services (WHS) contracts (Pentagon Reservation Offices), during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. The memorandum outlines: general social distancing and other safety requirements, situations when a contracted employee should remain at home and/or in quarantine and provides guidance on addressing issues related to contracted personnel returning to onsite locations.

Virginia

Phase 3 of the "Forward Virginia" plan has been presented to continue easing public health restrictions while mitigating the spread of COVID-19. The Commonwealth does not yet have a targeted date for entering Phase 3. In Phase 3, the Commonwealth will maintain a "Safer- at- Home" strategy with continued recommendations for social distancing, teleworking, and the requirement that individuals wear face coverings in indoor public settings.

Maryland

Maryland Department of Health officials are urging county leaders to step up local COVID-19 testing efforts and meet the goal of testing 10% of their populations. The state will soon begin publishing testing volume data by jurisdiction on coronavirus.maryland.gov so that Marylanders can track local progress. As of June 18, Maryland has tested 7.4% of the state's population.



The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) released [Guidance on Returning to Work](#). The publication contains recommendations as well as descriptions of mandatory safety and health standards.

BARDA and digital health company Empatica, are in the process of developing and seeking an FDA Emergency Use Authorization for Aura, a wearable system and algorithm that can serve as an early warning platform for COVID-19 infections. This system will utilize a wearable physiological monitor, Empatica's E4 wristband device, to detect early signs of infection in individuals. Study participants also will self-collect daily nasal swabs, self-report symptoms, and self-collect daily saturated oxygen read-outs for analysis. All data will be used to fine-tune and validate Empatica's early diagnostic algorithm, which will provide a probability of infection.





DESTRUCTION OF NPS PROPERTY DURING DEMONSTRATION

In the wake of Juneteenth rallies that took place yesterday, approximately 150-200 people pulled down and burned a statue of Albert Pike in D.C. late Friday night. The statue was located in Judiciary Square in NW D.C. and was owned and managed by NPS. USPP responded to the scene and documented the incident. [On Saturday, the NPS maintenance crew concluded the removal of the statue. Clean up of the park is now complete. A USPP ID technician has concluded collecting evidence and documenting the scene with photos and the park has reopened to the public.](#)

- **Wildland Fire Update** – The National Preparedness Level (PL) is currently 3, [with increasing fire activity throughout the Southwest and AK areas](#). The Southwest Area remains at PL 4. To date, [nearly 284,000 acres have burned throughout the Southwest](#), with [46,797 acres](#) burned on DOI managed lands. The fire activity in the Southwest Area continues to be largely on U.S. Forest Service and State lands. AK remains at PL 3. To date, [approximately 163,000 acres](#) have burned throughout the State, with nearly 36,000 acres burned on DOI-managed lands. Nationally, there are [21 fires](#) across Federal, State, County, and private lands being managed under a full containment strategy. There are [five](#) large DOI fires being managed under a full containment strategy, with two in AZ (Blue River Fire / 30,408 acres / 90% contained and Dry Lake Fire / 4,369 acres / 90% contained), one in CO (East Canyon Fire / 2,900 acres / 21% contained), [one in SD](#) (Wilson Road Fire / 1,577 acres / 95% contained) and [one in AK](#) (Ingakslugwat Hills Fire / 52,250 acres / 0% contained). There continue to be multiple large fires in AK on DOI, Forest Service, and State lands being managed with a strategy other than full suppression.
