
2022 Natural Resources Projects





- Mercury monitoring: continued sampling from Lake Clark, Kontrashibuna Lake, and Crescent Lake to better understand how mercury bioaccumulates in the food webs of lakes
- Invasive Plant Monitoring: high traffic waterbodies within the park
- Lake temperature: monitored yearround in Lake Clark since 2006, and in Kijik Lake since 2010
- Newhalen counting station: 193,000 sockeye salmon – 3rd lowest return since 2000 and almost 50% less that the 20-year average

- Day Camps Back On! Nondalton, Newhalen, Port Alsworth and Iliamna with hands on, interactive activities.
- Junior Ranger Programs Back on! weekly programs in Port Alsworth
- Distance Learning Scheduling distance learning for next year for communities in BB, AK Pen, Kenai Pen.
