## 2017 Yukon River Fall Salmon Fishery News Release # 11 District 2 Commercial Period 2

Districts Affected: Lower Yukon Area Fall Season Emergency Order # 10

## **District 2 Commercial Fishing:**

Commercial fishing will be open for one period in **District 2, from 5:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. Wednesday, July 26**. This will be a 4-hour commercial fishing period with gillnets restricted to 6-inch or smaller mesh size. Commercial fishermen should confirm their market before they fish. The sale of Chinook salmon is prohibited. Commercial gillnet fishermen can release live Chinook salmon or use them for subsistence purposes. Chinook salmon retained from commercial gillnet gear must be recorded on a fish ticket as retained but not sold.

## **District 2 Subsistence Fishing Schedule:**

Subsistence salmon fishing in District 2 is open during the fall season 7 days per week, 24 hours per day with gillnets restricted to a maximum mesh size of 7.5 inches, except for 12 hours before, during, and 12 hours after commercial fishing periods. For this commercial period, subsistence fishing will close at 5:00 a.m. Wednesday, July 26, and reopen at 9:00 a.m. Thursday, July 27. Fishermen may use 4-inch or smaller mesh size gillnets to target non-salmon species during subsistence salmon closures.
