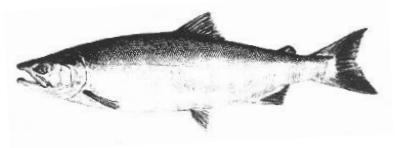

**2017 Yukon River Fall Salmon Fishery News Release #12
Subdistrict 4-A Commercial Fishing Schedule**

Districts Affected: Upper Yukon Area
Fall Season Emergency Order # 11

The 2017 fall chum salmon preseason run projection is for a run size greater than 1.1 million fish. The estimated fall chum salmon passage at the mainstem sonar near Pilot Station through July 24 is 223,100 fish, which is above the historical median of 87,700 fish for that date.

Subdistrict 4-A Commercial (from $\frac{3}{4}$ miles downstream of Old Paradise Village upstream to Cone Point):

Effective 12:01 a.m. Saturday, July 29, commercial fishing will be open 24-hours a day, seven days a week until 6 p.m. Sunday, August 6. Fishermen may use 6-inch or smaller mesh size set gillnets or fish wheels. Fish wheels do not need to be manned during the fall season commercial fishery. Commercial fishermen should confirm their market before they fish.

The sale of Chinook salmon is prohibited. Commercial fishermen can release live Chinook salmon or use them for subsistence purposes. All fish species harvested and not sold must be recorded on the fish ticket as "caught but not sold". All other salmon harvested during commercial fishing operations must be recorded on a fish ticket at the time of sale.

The commercial fishing schedule does not affect the current subsistence fishing schedule.

Processors, catcher sellers, or direct marketers must notify the department of their intent to operate by contacting the Fairbanks office at 459-7274.

Fishing schedules, test fish catches, and sonar counts are available 24 hours a day at (866) 479-7387 (toll free outside of Fairbanks); in Fairbanks, call (907) 459-7387.
