**2017 Yukon River Fall Salmon Fishery News Release # 44
District 2 Commercial Period 13
Districts Affected: Lower Yukon Area**

District 2 Commercial Fishing:

Commercial fishing will be open for one period in **District 2, from 2:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m., Thursday, August 24.** This will be a 7-hour commercial fishing period with gillnets restricted to 6-inch or smaller mesh size. **Commercial fishermen should confirm their buyer before they fish. St. Mary's and Mountain Village buying stations will be operating during this period.**

The sale of Chinook salmon is prohibited. Commercial gillnet fishermen can release live Chinook salmon or use them for subsistence purposes. Chinook salmon retained from commercial gillnet gear must be recorded on a fish ticket as retained but not sold.

District 2 Subsistence Fishing Schedule:

Subsistence salmon fishing in District 2 is open during the fall season 7 days per week, 24 hours per day with gillnets restricted to a maximum mesh size of 7.5 inches, except for closures before, during and after commercial fishing periods. **For this short notice commercial period, subsistence fishing will be closed Thursday, August 24 from 1:00 p.m. until 11:00 p.m.** Fishermen may use 4-inch or smaller mesh size gillnets to target non-salmon species during subsistence salmon closures.
