Public hearing announced for Temporary Wildlife Special Action Request WSA20-07 concerning community harvest systems in Units 11, 12, and 13

A telephonic public hearing is scheduled for 6:00 - 8:00 p.m., or until the end of public participation, on Thursday, August 13, 2020, to receive public testimony on a temporary special action request submitted to the Federal Subsistence Board (Board).

Temporary Special Action Request WSA20-07, submitted by the Office of Subsistence Management, requests an exception to 50 CFR 100.26(e)(2) for the Ahtna Intertribal Resource Commission (AITRC)-administered community harvest systems for moose and caribou in Units 11, 12, and 13 for the 2020-2022 regulatory cycle. This request would add language to the regulations for the community harvest systems in these three units as follows:

"Animals taken by those opting to participate in this community harvest system do not count toward the harvest limits of any individuals who do not opt to participate in this community harvest system."
